Anote from the Dean:

For those of you who celebrated Easter on the 27th, I wish you a happy and blessed Holyday. I wish all of you a Happy Spring! Of course, related to that we all wish J.S. Bach a Happy 331st Birthday – and I never have to worry about remembering that since my father celebrates on the same day as Bach – (though, my father only turned 90 on Bach's Birthday!).

Several more programs of interest – as you know, our Evensong is coming up for April and our 'Organ Crawl' in Savannah in May. June marks our Annual Chapter Meeting and installation of Officers! In addition, of course, we have 2nd Friday concerts at Saint Luke's Church all three months (April 8, May 13 and June 10).

So between now and July 1, we have 6 events for you to attend!

We are in the process of starting some Grant proposals (the first one was submitted on March 31). Different members of our Board are researching other grants – these grants are all aimed at building our LCCAGO Scholarship Fund. This is a fund that I believe that we, as organists and organ enthusiasts, should all support in whatever manner we can, since it is aimed at fostering new organists who will take our places in a few years.

I wrote within the last year of the reasons for us to be involved in this endeavor, and I still believe that it is our duty as members of the AGO (pledged to support the organ and its literature) to do everything we can to assure that a new crop of organists is in higher education. To that end, we voted last year to establish this fund and to appoint a committee when the fund got large enough which would establish a program to make scholarship aid available to those who will carry on the work that we are all involved with.

Grants will help, as will public programs. Our association with piano teachers through our Pizza/Pipes and Organ Encounters will hopefully attract students, already on the road to keyboard facility, to consider studying organ. I have been approached by one of the teachers who attended our multi-church program on HHI to take on one of her piano students who has expressed an interest! There are many ways to attract new talent to the organ – how can each of you make a contribution toward that goal?

We always value your input in our programming throughout the year. I have just appointed a committee to begin preparing the 2016-2017 chapter year programs. If you have an idea to share, please send it to our current Program Chair, Nina Rodman, so that the committee, once formed, can incorporate it!

It has been about 7 months since I have moved out to Dallas, and I love it! Last fall, I began my first year in the MMOrgan Performance program at Southern Methodist University where I study with Professor Stefan Engels. Some of you may remember him from his time in Charleston a few years ago. He is an excellent teacher with a great reputation. One of the reasons I came to his studio was because I wanted to spend some time working on the German Romantic repertoire. This was not something I had the chance to cover during my undergraduate years at Oberlin and since this is Professor Engels's specialty, I figured now would be an excellent time! From that particular era, I am working on a few movements of Sigfrid Karg-Elert's lyrical *Cathedral Windows*, Op. 106 as well as Max Reger's Toccata and Fugue in D Minor/Major, Op. 59, No. 5 and 6. However, I feel my connection has always been with the French 20th century repertoire. I am about half way finished with learning Olivier Messiaen's *Messe de la Pentecôte*- a wonderful 30-minute work that shows just about the entire breadth of his musical language.

In February, I began my job as Minister of Music at First United Lutheran Church of Dallas. Here, I play the organ for all worship services and oversee a choral scholar program affiliated with the Meadows School of the Arts at SMU. We have a wonderful Karl Wilhelm 2-manual/22 rank Baroque organ. I honestly have never heard such clear voicing on an instrument. A few weeks ago, I played in the 45th Annual William C. Hall Pipe Organ Competition in San Antonio. There was some serious competition between members from different organ studios in the state of TX, but I was very happy to come home with winning the Prize for Excellence in Hymn Playing! My hymn was I Sing the Mighty Power of God (tune ELLACOMBE.) (Charlie, if you are reading this, First Presbyterian Church in San Antonio has your hymnal!)

I have some exciting things that are coming up in the next few months. On April 8th, I will be playing a 30-minute noontime recital at Trinity Church Copley Square in Boston, MA. Each Friday, they have a guest come and play a recital. I have chosen to perform works of Alain, Bach, and Karg-Elert. I look forward to getting to know the wonderful Skinner organ of Trinity. In June, I will be attending the Houston AGO National Convention- I hope to see some of you there! This July, I will be returning to the Royal School of Church Music in America's Carolina Course held in Raleigh, NC. Last year, I had the great pleasure of serving as organ scholar and this year I will be serving as the assistant course organist and the conducting scholar. Michael Velting from Christ Church Cathedral (Nashville) will be directing the course and I look forward to working with him! This year will be especially meaningful as our closing evensong will be held in Duke Chapel. Colin Lynch, the course organist, and I will be presenting a 30-minute pre-evensong recital on the instruments of Duke. If some of you feel like making a drive to Charlotte, NC on Sunday, August 7th, I will be playing a recital at The Myers Park Baptist Church beginning at 7pm. This is part of the Charlotte AGO Summer Recital Series. My program is still to be determined- although a few pieces have been decided!

While I am away from my home in Beaufort, I truly miss being there. I keep up through folks and I enjoy seeing what's updated on the Lowcountry AGO website. I am so pleased to see that this chapter is so active and constantly presenting beautiful music through events for the community! For those of you who are new to the area and have taken positions in Beaufort-Bluffton-Hilton Head, I would like to extend a warm welcome to you from Dallas!




